## **A Special IFRAA Event – Dinner at The Basilica of Saint Mary (Event 48)**

*This is an open event for anyone interested in attending. Signing up requires an additional fee of \$65 per person.*

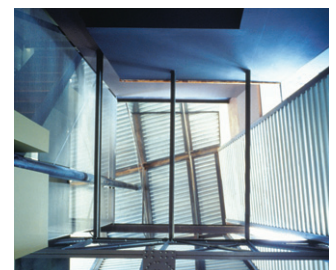
This evening event will begin with an opportunity to tour The Basilica of Saint Mary and enjoy the Icon exhibit in the Sanctuary (50 icons from different Orthodox traditions: Romanian, Ethiopian, Greek, Russian, Ukrainian, etc). Dinner will be served and Dr. Johan van Parys, Dr. Richard Vosko, and Dean Thomas Fisher will comment on the strength of Minnesota's architectural contributions to religious architecture with a presentation that highlights the region's international IFRAA/AIA Award recipient projects. The evening will conclude with a 30-minute musical experience of organ, piano and voice. The Basilica's Schola Cantorum will sing three different pieces of music: Gregorian chant, polyphony and contemporary from three different locations in the building: Choir stall, sanctuary and balcony. Additionally, there will be an organ piece demonstrating the capabilities of the newly refurbished organ and a piano piece showing how both instruments work in the space.

This bus tour will travel to five exemplary worship spaces that illustrate the use of light, sound, tradition, innovation, and art. The tour will proudly display the broad spectrum of religious architecture and art within the Twin Cities area and each stop will have the project architects and artists available to join in the discussion and tour.
