- Volunteer excellence in the American Institute of Architects national committee activities exemplifying professionalism, dedication and ability in demonstrating the skills to consistently foster the advancement of the Institute at a national or regional level.
- Volunteer excellence in community or organizational activities outside of AIA Minnesota exemplifying the best in leadership qualities displayed to the public.

Eligibility

Any member of AIA Minnesota may nominate candidates for the Louis Lundgren Award. To be eligible, a candidate must be a member of AIA Minnesota for a period of not less than ten years and be a member in good standing at the time of nomination. Emeritus members are eligible.

Submissions

The sponsor should submit a letter of recommendation along with documentation that support the candidate's volunteerism. Documentation should include a list of references (names and addresses) of witnesses to volunteer efforts, exhibits showing accomplishments of volunteer efforts, publications or articles addressing those accomplishments, and/or any other items supporting the quality of the candidate's volunteer efforts.

Selection

The Awards Committee reviews nominations and oversees the process of selection.

Winners will also be required to provide AIA Minnesota with one to two 22-1/2" x 22-1/2" exhibition board(s) displaying the winner's contributions. AIA Minnesota must receive photos and display boards no later than October 22, 2010.
