The Leadership Forum develops and fosters leadership skills of mid-career members of AIA Minnesota and MSP NOMA. The content of the curriculum provides insight and tools for growth in the areas of leadership styles, values, self-awareness, intercultural leadership, communication, motivation, and engagement. In addition, these concepts are explored through the presentation of leadership case studies, the discussion of future trends and advocacy, and examples of how to apply and implement these concepts.

The content is presented by a variety of leaders, including AEC professionals, academic instructors and independent consultants. The Leadership Forum ultimately provides each cohort with a network of diverse professionals focused on leadership development.
