

AIA Minnesota Donation Acceptance Policy

AIA Minnesota is a nonprofit 501c6 organization and therefore is not able to accept tax-deductible donations. Individuals, corporations and organizations with philanthropic intent who are interested in furthering the profession of architecture and/or the design of the built environment in Minnesota are encouraged to donate to the Minnesota Architectural Foundation (a 501c3 nonprofit organization).

Members and others who have an interest in furthering the mission of AIA Minnesota and its programs and services and who would like to provide in-kind donations (e.g., volunteer time, meeting space, promotional activities, design services, etc.) or who would like to provide funding in support of AIA programs and services (e.g., food or beverage for an event, speaker costs, etc.) should make their interests known to the AIA Minnesota Executive Vice President or AIA Minnesota staff. When considering whether to solicit or accept donations, AIA Minnesota will consider the following factors:

- Values – whether the acceptance of the donation compromises any of the core values of AIA Minnesota;
- Compatibility -- whether there is compatibility between the intent of the donor and AIA Minnesota's use of the donation;
- Public Relationships – whether acceptance of the donation damages the reputation of AIA Minnesota;
- Benefit – whether there is an appropriate balance of benefit to AIA Minnesota and to the donor in accepting the donation;
- Consistency – whether acceptance of the donation is consistent with past practice of AIA Minnesota;
- Form of Donation – whether the donation offered is in a form that AIA Minnesota can use without incurring substantial expense or difficulty; and
- Effect on Future Donations – whether the donation encourages or discourages future donations.

All decisions to solicit and/or accept potentially controversial donations will be made by the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors in consultation with the Executive Vice President. The primary consideration will be the impact of the donation on the organization. Providing a donation to AIA Minnesota does not equate to donor control over AIA Minnesota programs or services (i.e., content, speaker selection, logistics, or other aspects of the program or service).

If it is determined that such donations meet these standards, the donating individual/organization will receive promotional and/or on-site recognition for their support. Such contributions are not tax deductible.
