



Proposed Amendments to AIA St. Paul Bylaws during Annual Meeting

At the 2022 AIA St. Paul annual meeting, an in-person event scheduled for Tuesday, October 25, there will be a vote of the AIA St. Paul membership on whether to amend the chapter Bylaws. Specific amendments would adjust AIA St. Paul board of directors composition to include representatives from each National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB) accredited educational institution located within Minnesota. General, or clean up, amendments include a simplified format, removal of unnecessary recitation of text in AIA bylaws, grammatical updates, and edits to align with AIA model bylaws.

In February 2020, Dunwoody College of Technology's Bachelor of Architecture degree program was granted accreditation by the NAAB. Dunwoody College of Technology joined the University of Minnesota as the second NAAB accredited educational institution in Minnesota. Current Bylaws focus on the University of Minnesota, while proposed revisions are inclusive of all NAAB accredited programs within the state.

In advance of the member congress, we ask that you review the proposed bylaw amendments.
