Entry-Level Pay, In Context

What is fair pay for new graduates with architecture degrees?

Most commonly, people within the profession look to the <u>AIA Salary Calculator</u> to inform their answer. For our geographic region, the median salary reported for recent college graduates, non-licensed, with a professional degree in architecture, is \$49,000, or \$23.56 per hour.

Of course, the median number means there are firms paying above and below this number. The decision of what salary to offer is influenced by a firm's values, if they want to be seen as an employer of choice, and the economic conditions of the firm.

As we emerge from the pandemic recession – which has been experienced unevenly by the architecture profession, depending on the pre-pandemic client base – there are certainly firms that are caught in a tough place, needing to expand their staff teams yet not being in a solid financial position.

But how low is too low when it comes to pay? And what should we be aiming for? Read more »

Scheduling. Within the program proposal form, you will have the opportunity to indicate your preference for presentation at either a virtual or an in-person day of the conference. If your proposal is selected, the final scheduling decision will be made by the selection committee and AIA Minnesota staff. In an effort to minimize the climate impact of this conference, we will be scheduling programs with out-of-town speakers on virtual days as much as possible.

Topics to Propose. The selection committee seeks proposals on a wide variety of topics for all building types including, but not limited to: Practice; Design; Sustainable, Resilient, Regenerative Design; Equity in the Built Environment; Materials and Systems; Technology; Preservation; Rural Design; Urban Design; Equity in the Profession; the Future of the Profession; and Ethics.

Proposal Details. All proposals must include the following: title, program description, learning objectives, program format, intended audience, speakers, preferred program length, preference for virtual or in-person delivery.

The Capitol Area Architectural and Planning Board (CAAPB), created by the Legislature in 1969, is an independent Board established to preserve and enhance the dignity, beauty, and architectural integrity of the capitol, the buildings adjacent to it, the capitol grounds, and the capitol area. The Executive Secretary, in collaboration with other agencies, is responsible for artwork, grounds, restoration, preservation, zoning and other usage of the capitol area.

The Executive Secretary will regularly interact with board members, the Minnesota Department of Administration, the Minnesota Historical Society, the City of Saint Paul, legislature, regional agencies, neighborhood planning organizations, district councils, development groups, and area businesses.
