What Does Advocacy Mean to You?

Advocacy can be something as small as giving kudos to someone in a meeting when they aren't there, or it can be as big as lobbying for a cause you believe in with public officials. When I think broadly of advocacy, it seems selfless – and often it is.

That wasn't the case for me though – I fell into advocacy from a personal need. At the time I was working full time, a mother of two small kids, and my husband was also working full time and going to law school at night. I was not thriving at all – I was barely surviving. So, I reached out to a few women architects who were also moms of young children to ask how they were making it all work. But what I discovered is that many women in our profession were struggling – and not just moms.

From this spark of self-interest and shared struggle the Women in Architecture Committee was formed. It became my lifeline. Things didn't stop there though – I continued speaking all over the country about the challenges that women in architecture face. Suddenly, without really knowing it, I was advocating. My point is, sometimes even seemingly selfless acts arise from very personal needs, and that doesn't make these acts of advocacy any less powerful. In fact, I think it amplifies them.

We have opportunities to advocate every single day. Again, sometimes these are small actions of our everyday work in architecture, and sometimes they are bigger, with broader impact on the profession or the built environment. There are some great opportunities to engage in those bigger opportunities right now, including partnering with AIA Minnesota on our legislative work to get bills passed at the Capitol during the session that starts February 12:

- We are advocating for a bonding package that emphasizes housing and infrastructure, and for one to happen this year to get bonding back “on cycle”

after years of unpredictability. This will help ensure a healthy pipeline of business opportunities for our profession and a better built environment for our communities across the state.

- We are advocating for climate action, particularly via advancing the building code to achieve maximum energy savings, embodied carbon reductions, and materials improvements. Architects are directly involved in the building code process and in shaping the bills that drive funding, staff, and support for climate action at the state level.
- We are working with industry partners on climate action via discussions about energy benchmarking and embodied carbon in materials, and will advocate for solutions throughout the legislative session that take building performance to the next level.
- We constantly advocate for a codes process that is driven by experts and all stakeholders, which we have in place, rather than a politicized process that doesn't center technical knowledge.

So, as you go through your day, consider the many opportunities you have to advocate for someone or something. I know you are all doing those small, and incredibly meaningful acts of advocacy every day in your workplace. Now is the time to consider how you can engage in some of these bigger and broadly impactful opportunities, too.

Represent AIA Minnesota on Building Code Technical Advisory Groups

AIA Minnesota has several opportunities for members to serve on Technical Advisory Groups (TAGs) that assist the Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry in updating sections of the Building Code.

Members will review code and make recommendations to the Construction Codes

Advisory Council (CCAC). Each TAG will meet multiple times during spring and early summer of 2024, with meeting times yet to be determined for each group.

- Mn Rules Chapter 1300, Building Code Administration & Mn Rules Chapter 1302, Construction approval.
- Mn Rules Chapter 1303, Minnesota Provisions.
- Mn Rules Chapter 1307, Elevators and Related Devices.
- Mn Rule Chapter 1346, 2024 IBC & 2024 IFGC/ Mechanical Code
- Mn Rules for Structural Review of the 2024 IBC/IRC/IEBC/MN Rule 1303

Campaign Finance Board Changes that Could Impact Architects

The Minnesota Campaign Finance Board (CFB) is currently adopting rules to implement statutory changes made in 2023 to expand the definition of "lobbyist" in ways that may trigger a need for architects to register as lobbyists due to their interactions with government entities, including cities and counties.

New laws now in effect define a lobbyist as:

- Any person who receives \$3,000 or more or spends \$3,000 of personal funds:
 - Attempting to influence certain government action by communicating with or encouraging others to communicate with government officials or
 - From a business whose primary source of revenue is facilitating government relations consulting work

In addition, a new definition of “action by a political subdivision” means it is considered lobbying when any individual interacts with city, county, and local officials on:

- Any action that requires a vote or approval by one or more elected local officials while acting in their official capacity; or an action by an appointed or employed local official to make, to recommend, or to vote on as a member of the governing body, major decisions regarding the expenditure or investment of public money.

Attorneys, accountants, engineers, developers, and others in the AEC industry, including AIA Minnesota, are seeking further clarity about how these rules apply to the practice of architecture. The CFB has produced a number of [advisory opinions](#), and continues to refine rules that interpret the statute. AIA Minnesota will be closely monitoring the rulemaking and advisory opinion process, and will contact legislators if statutory change is required.

Please contact [Sheri Hansen](#) with questions, comments, or specific situations on which your firm might want guidance for compliance with this law, as AIA Minnesota can seek an advisory opinion to clarify interpretation on your behalf.

Firm leaders and individual practitioners are encouraged to consult their

general counsel to determine if any staff members should register as lobbyists.
