New Leadership Development Program

FURTHER EDI, GROW EFFECTIVENESS WITH CLIENTS & END USERS

Do you want to strengthen your ability to lead successful equity, diversity, and inclusion efforts in your firm? Interested in more effectively engaging with clients and end users who are demographically or ideologically different from you? If so, we invite you to consider applying to participate in this new leadership program from AIA Minnesota.

The purpose of the Intercultural Leadership Program (ILP) is to grow the ability of individuals to recognize and adapt to "differences that make a difference" - differences of gender, age, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, religion, physical ability, political affiliation, etc. In addition to intensive, cohort-based learning sessions, participants will take the Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI) assessment and receive personalized development plans that grow their ability to create more inclusive, equitable firms and to become more effective in engaging with clients and the general public in the work of architecture.

ILP's target audience is individuals who lead firms, lead practice groups, lead teams, and/or are direct supervisors, with the intent of facilitating broader impact within their firms. Two individuals per firm will need to participate, unless a firm's employees number less than 25, in which case a single individual from the firm can participate; that individual would likely be paired with another representative of a smaller-sized firm for purposes of activities within and outside of the learning sessions. Individuals who are interested in participating will need to obtain a letter of support and a statement of commitment from firm leadership.

AIA Minnesota is working in partnership with the U of M School of Architecture to launch and to refine this program. Firms that are active in the M.S. in Architecture - Research Practices program will be given preference in the selection process.

HERITAGE PRESERVATION AWARDS TAKE HIATUS IN 2018

The Minneapolis Preservation Awards program is going on hiatus during 2018. A long-standing partnership between the AIA Minneapolis chapter, the Minneapolis Heritage Preservation Commission, and Preserve Minneapolis, the Minneapolis Preservation Awards is an annual awards program that recognizes the architects, developers, volunteers, enthusiasts, and preservation professionals that protect and celebrate the City's built history. 
