Sharing our Gifts

Ethically speaking, our Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct states that "Members should embrace the spirit and letter of the law governing their

professional affairs and should promote and serve the public interest in their personal and professional activities." Yes, we do this each day professionally in our 9-5, but what about beyond the workplace? Could your neighborhood school or favorite charity use your time for a short-term project? How about applying for a leadership position with AIA Minnesota? That's a real tangible one! These are great ways to leverage your design talent to serve society.

In full transparency, my other love language is receiving gifts, which requires a bit of unpacking in case you aren't familiar with the "The 5 Love Languages." KEYNOTE PREVIEW

This year's conference will feature a keynote address on each of the three days.

Wednesday, November 9

Working Conditions, Prosperity, and Culture Change in Architecture

This keynote will be presented by a panel of firm leaders at various career stages who will speak to what's broken about the business and everyday experience of working in architecture, why change efforts get bogged down, and ideas for how to break the logjam and accelerate progress. Facilitated by Mary-Margaret Zindren, EVP of AIA Minnesota. Panelists are currently being confirmed.

Thursday, November 10

Wanda Dalla Costa, AIA, LEED AP, is a member of the Saddle Lake Cree Nation. She is an architect and an Institute professor and was recently named the 2022 Honorary Fellow of the Royal Architecture Institute of Canada. At Arizona State University, she is the director and founder of the Indigenous Design Collaborative, a community-driven design and construction program, which brings together tribal community members, industry, and a multidisciplinary team of ASU students and faculty to co-design solutions for tribal communities. Dalla Costa was part of Unceded at the 2018 Venice Biennale where she joined 18 Indigenous architects from across Turtle Island to share an Indigenous vision of the future. Her firm, Tawaw Architecture Collective, works across North America, and is based in Phoenix.

This keynote presentation will conclude with a one-on-one conversation between Wanda and AIA Minnesota president, **Alicia Belton, FAIA, NOMA**. With over 30 years of experience in practicing architecture, Alicia is founding principal of Urban Design Perspectives where she works with clients to manage their design and building process of workplace, housing, religious and hospitality sectors.

Friday, November 11

Jason Twill, LEED Fellow has a career spanning over 24 years in climate change policy, education, sustainability, and urban regeneration. His work has been at the forefront of social, ecological, and economic transformation. A globally recognized leader in sustainable urbanism and green economics, Jason's work is advancing next-generation solutions to address global warming, restore planetary health, and ensure economic well-being. Jason is currently serving as director of the World Cup Legacy at the Qatar Foundation, where he is leading the Foundation's sustainability and legacy objectives pertaining to the country's hosting of the 2022 FIFA World Cup. As founder and director of Urban Apostles, Jason led an urban strategy and sustainability advisory firm specializing in equitable, inclusive, and sustainable growth strategies for cities across Australia and New Zealand. He is a cofounder of both the International Living Future Institute and the Green Sports Alliance and the originator of the Economics of Change research project. In 2017, Jason founded and launched the City Makers' Guild, an education, advocacy, and

research group promoting more equitable, sustainable, and inclusive cities.

This keynote presentation will conclude with a one-on-one conversation between Jason and Paul D. Bauknight, Jr. Paul is trained as an architect, is an urban designer, design activist, and community leader. Working in community-based design and development for over 30 years, he is passionately committed to working at the intersection of social, cultural, economic, and spatial systems creating solutions that are equitable and steeped in place, that benefit the community.
