#### (RE)IGNITE YOUR PASSION

2023 is off and running! In the blur of activity heading into February, it can be easy to lose sight of the intentions we may have set for ourselves. You might have had some broad goals and ideas heading into the new year but haven't yet found a good way to move them forward.

If any of your intentions relate to inspiration, creativity, or advocacy, AIA Minnesota is here to help. Taking a cue from

the student-led installation within Rapson Hall facilitated by Adjunct Professor Leon Wang, it's important for architectural designers and architects of all ages to regularly (re)ignite areas of passion that bring you joy and fuel your sense of purpose. Here are some near-term ways AIA Minnesota can help:

**Get inspired** – Inspiration often comes to us when we step away from our everyday experiences; when we open our minds to new areas of knowledge in which we don't have experience or expertise. The <u>Lake Superior Design</u> Retreat (LSDR) is back in person in Duluth, February 24–25. You'll hear from people who uniquely explore the intersections of textiles + climate action and storytelling + placemaking; from a celebrated actor/director/screenwriter who leads workshops with people experiencing mental illness; the leader of the global Fixit Clinic's approach to disassembly, troubleshooting, and repair; and an Indigenous architect whose work was featured in Canada's pavilion at the Venice Biennale.

**Get creative** – Incubating creative solutions within intense timeframes is core to the traditional architectural charette. Three AIA Minnesota charette approaches are alive and well, and evolving to be more relevant than ever. During the next few months, you can get your creative juices flowing through one or more of these charettes: Search for Shelter is taking a hybrid approach to supporting projects for people experiencing homelessness. The Minnesota Design Team is gearing up for community visits in Greater Minnesota, responding to challenges faced by small, rural cities with ideas borne out of thoughtful community engagement and interdisciplinary teams of volunteers. And the MAF's Ralph Rapson Traveling Study Award (RRTSA) program – which will be changing to strengthen its relevance and impact (see the Matrix story below from the RRTSA Task Force) – is expected to launch the 2023

competition later this Spring.

**Get active** – While you may be turning to things like walking, skiing, or rebounding on a trampoline (my own intention!) to get more active physically, AIA Minnesota can help you get active in other ways – specifically, legislative action and climate action. It's one of the busiest years in recent memory at the Minnesota State Legislature, and the <u>Government Affairs Committee</u> is mentoring new volunteers in finding their voice when talking with policymakers about the issues that matter in the built environment. You can also get active by (literally) activating your free access to <u>BuildingGreen.com</u>. If you've been slow to get started in integrating sustainable design into your own practice, including pursuing the 2030 Commitment or the Materials Pledge, take advantage of what AIA Minneapolis has secured for all AIA Minnesota members: 2023 access to the resources of BuildingGreen.com at no cost. ## Early Progress in the 2023 Legislative Session

Action picked up almost immediately at the Capitol this year, with a tax conformity bill passing through the process and signed by the Governor within the first two weeks of the session. The Governor's budget includes a reinstatement of the Historic Preservation Tax Credit, significant funding for climate action and commercial energy code advancement, making the built environment more resilient, and affordable housing funding.

AIA Minnesota members and staff have met with 10 legislators and provided testimony on specific bills and topics from climate action and affordable housing to the business of architecture this session. There is always need for architects to share their knowledge and experience with legislators during the session; if you are interested in participating in our advocacy efforts, please join us for a Government Affairs Committee meeting (details below) or contact <a href="Sheri Hansen">Sheri Hansen</a>.



#### Capital Investment Outlook

Governor Walz has proposed a \$3.3 billion capital investment and bonding package as part of his budget. There are significant proposed investments in asset preservation, affordable housing, and transportation infrastructure. The legislature will consider this proposal as it crafts

the state's budget for the next biennium.

Leaders of bonding and capital investment committees in both chambers have expressed interest in completing a capital investment package early in the session. AIA Minnesota staff and our partners in the Building Jobs Coalition are monitoring progress on these initiatives and will continue to advocate for a robust bonding bill to be completed as soon as possible.

# Ralph Rapson Traveling Study Award Task Force Recommendations Approved by MAF Board

Recommendations to strengthen the Ralph Rapson Traveling Study Award (RRTSA) and its relevance for the future were made by the RRTSA Task Force to the Minnesota Architectural Foundation (MAF) Board of Directors at their January 24<sup>th</sup> meeting. The MAF Board unanimously approved the recommendations. Changes will be phased in over the next two years and for 2023 will include:

- Finalists who are not selected to receive the traveling study award would receive an "Honorable Mention" award and \$500; and
- The timeframe for the competition will expand to take place over two
  weekends (the recommendation adopted was a timeframe of 10-14 days).
   Additional recommendations adopted that would be phased in over 2023 and 2024
  relate to time of year, advance notice of competition dates, jury composition,
  development of the brief, selection process, and broadly sharing the competition

#### **ARE SCAM ALERT**

NCARB has recently become aware of a new online scam related to the Architect Registration Examination (ARE). You may encounter Instagram posts or posts on other social media platforms promising an easy way to get licensed without taking the ARE. The scam typically asks you to provide your personal registration information and a sum of money, with a claim that the scammer will take your exam for you. While follow-through on this promise would be unethical and subject to serious disciplinary and legal action, in most cases, the scammer simply takes your payment and personal information.

#### ONLINE PROCTORING SYSTEMS REQUIREMENT UPDATE

If you have an upcoming online proctored exam, please review PSI's updated online proctoring technical requirements, perform a system check, and schedule a test run through your NCARB Record to confirm your computer and testing space meet the requirements for online proctoring.
