AIA MINNESOTA

This is an important time in the leadership of AIA Minnesota, the local chapters and the Foundation. By joining the leadership teams of any of these groups, you will be engaged in key decisions in response to member research conducted throughout 2016, and implementing each organization's strategic direction.

Who should apply to serve as an AIA Minnesota officer or associate director?

Any AIA Minnesota member in good standing is eligible to apply for an open officer position. The Nominating Committee is particularly interested in members who have these qualifications and experience:

- Demonstrated leadership skills and leadership experience within a firm setting and/or within the profession
- Engagement in AIA Minnesota, a local AIA Minnesota chapter, and/or AIA on a national level
- Professional achievement in the field of architecture
- Strategic thinking skills and abilities
- Communications skills (oral and written, in various settings, and with a wide variety of individuals)
- Commitment to growing diversity and inclusion in the profession and within AIA Minnesota
- Emotional intelligence and the ability to engage and facilitate inclusive group decision-making
- Compatibility with the AIA Minnesota Board of Directors, officers, and staff

What is the selection process?

Anyone interested in being considered as a candidate should **complete an application** form by September 12, 2016.

Following the September 12, 2016 deadline for applications, the Nominating Committee will work to determine its recommended slate of candidates. The selection process will include individual interviews with the Nominating Committee. If many applications are received for a particular position, the Committee may narrow down the list of candidates to be interviewed based on the qualifications demonstrated in the written applications.

The Nominating Committee will present a slate of candidates for consideration by the AIA Minnesota Board of Directors at its October meeting. The slate approved by the Board of Directors will be communicated to the membership and voted on at the Annual Meeting held during the AIA Minnesota Convention & Expo. Successful candidates will assume office on January 1, 2017.




