TAKE A BREAK

With the increased pace of service delivery, the pressure to keep the pipeline full and productive is real and constant. I think we convince ourselves that at some magic point in the not too distant future we'll be all caught up, and then we'll take a break.

That last one, especially, hits awfully close to home for me.

As firm leaders, we need to set the example, to encourage "the break." It seems almost decadent, and the first time you make a conscious effort to take a midday walk, move around the office, or take a work-free vacation, you might feel a bit unsettled, but science tells us—your time will be paid back in spades. Test the theory.

AIA Minnesota 2016 Gold Medal Award

REVISED GOLD MEDAL AWARD PROCESS & NEW AUGUST 5TH DEADLINE

In late June 2016, the AIA Minnesota Gold Medal Award Selection Committee recommended, and the AIA Minnesota Executive Committee approved, a revised approach for our Gold Medal Award nomination and selection process—and a **new deadline for 2016: Friday, August 5th**.

Overall, AIA Minnesota has been shifting toward a more transparent approach to its processes and procedures. We have also been working to become consistent with AIA National's processes, procedures, and awards criteria (related to our recent accreditation process). This year's AIA Minnesota Gold Medal Award Selection Committee and Executive Committee have determined that such inconsistencies that relate to the AIA Minnesota Gold Medal Award should be rectified, starting this year.

Nominations Eligibility, Selection Criteria and Process

The full eligibility, selection criteria, and process are available on the AIA Minnesota website. **Key elements** to note are the following:

- Eligibility: Consistent with the AIA National criteria for the AIA Gold Medal Award, the AIA Minnesota Gold Medal Award is open to a single individual or two individuals (living or deceased, not necessarily an American or an architect), who have created a body of distinguished architectural work.
- Nominations: Nominations made by an AIA Minnesota member will be accepted for review by the Gold Medal Award Selection Committee. Selection Committee members will be ineligible to make nominations—before or after the deadline. Nominators may not be a principal and/or employee of the candidate or the candidate's firm.
- Selection Criteria: The AIA Minnesota Gold Medal Award Selection Committee will evaluate candidates based on how well they meet program criteria, which include how their contributions have: demonstrated great depth and breadth, having a cumulative effect on the profession of architecture in Minnesota; addressed the future of architecture while honoring its tradition; transcended or united specific areas of expertise; and become widely known—by architects, designers, educators, and the public—for the quality of their work.
- Additional selection considerations: Any
 aspect of work or life experience that may
 have reflected contributions or sensitivity
 concerning areas of special interest to AIA
 Minnesota, its members, and the architecture
 profession in Minnesota, including but not
 limited to the policy and position statements
 of AIA Minnesota. These might include such
 areas as diversity, sustainability, architectural

education, or the mentoring of emerging professionals, to the degree the entrant has had the opportunity to address them, or as these topics may enhance the presentation.

• Gold Medal Award Selection Committee:

- Committee members are ineligible to submit nominations during their time of service on the committee. Communication with the Gold Medal Award Selection Committee in any given year regarding any aspect of the nomination or selection process—from the time the Selection Committee is convened to the completion of the selection process—by the nominator, nominee(s), or anyone acting on their behalf, is inappropriate and will be cause for disqualification. For 2016, the nominating process is considered to have begun with the publication of notice in this Matrix newsletter (July 7, 2016). The list of 2016 committee members is provided on the AIA Minnesota website.
- Nomination Submission Requirements: All supporting documentation must be submitted in a single PDF file—not to exceed 10MB and not to exceed fifteen (15) pages—and shall consist of: a nomination letter addressed to the Committee Chair, summarizing the contributions of the candidate(s), not to exceed one page: a brief biography of the candidate(s), not to exceed two pages; a statement or list of the achievements of the candidate(s), not to exceed two pages; descriptive statements and/or images related to the body of work created by the candidate(s), not to exceed four pages: a maximum of three letters of support, addressed to the Committee Chair, not to exceed one page each; and optional miscellaneous material, including clippings, articles, etc., not to exceed three pages.
- Secrecy: To the extent practicable, nominators are encouraged to gather and submit materials for the nomination submission without the knowledge of the nominated candidate(s), as the disclosure of the Gold Medal Award winner has traditionally been a surprise to the nominee/selected candidate(s) and the desire is to continue this tradition.
- Confirmation of Selection: The Gold Medal Award Selection Committee will present its recommended selection for the award to the AIA Minnesota Board of Directors. In order for that selection to be confirmed, it must be approved by at least a 3/4 vote of the Board.
