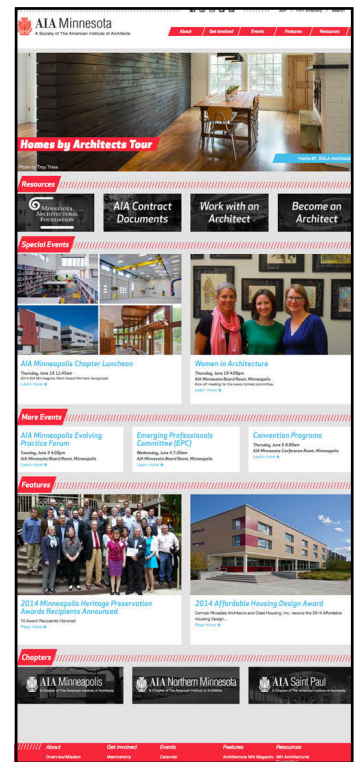
### New Platform, New Design, New Navigation

# COMMITTEE UPDATES

## Architects Reaching Students



AIA Minnesota's Architecture in the Schools (AIS) committee members worked with FAIR School Crystal campus teachers and administrators to develop a curriculum to introduce seventh grade students to mathematical concepts through architecture. Implemented in May, the program presents a hypothetical design challenge for students to work in small groups to propose real-world solutions.

Students were challenged to design a sculpture for their school courtyard regarding, "How does FAIR School exist within the greater community?" Students measured and analyzed the site, created a material list and budget, built a scale model, and lastly—presented their model and concept to peers and a selection committee.

ATS&R was instrumental in the development and implementation of the architecture unit (*Intern Architect Eric Anderson, Assoc. AIA, is pictured above with students*). Firm employees volunteered to assist students with each step of the process—attending classes to work with small groups and hosting a Class Competition Celebration. Selected students, and volunteers, were honored at the conclusion of the unit at a luncheon held at ATS&R's office.

The new FAIR School Crystal partnership program builds upon AIS's success in rolling out a similar program with FAIR School Downtown, in which firms Cuningham Group Architecture, Inc. and AECOM helped implement programs and provided volunteer support. AIS' mission is to seek and create ties to the K-12 education community by introducing students to the fundamental concepts of architecture and by educating students about architecture as a future career option.

## The Consortium for Research Practices

The Consortium for Research Practices and the Masters of Science in Architecture, Research Practices concentration, successfully completed its first year with a total of ten student research projects. Students worked with firm mentors and faculty on structured research projects that met the needs of the firm and provided students with important leadership experiences as well as advancing their progress in completing IDP. Additionally there is strong early success to report on the ARE exam completion by the one student who was eligible this year who passed all of the sections attempted. The Consortium firm members as a group made a great deal of progress streamlining processes for identifying research priorities, supporting and leveraging the work in their firms as well as agreeing to protocols for sharing work within the group and to the larger industry.

Its clear from this first year that the "broken knowledge loop" between academia and industry/practice is well on its way to a robust exchange and new culture of advancement. There continues to be much interest in the program nationally, faculty and students presented the work and ideas many major national and regional venues. Additionally the Consortium and students were highlighted in an Architect magazine article and in several national conferences on topics ranging from education to virtual reality.

## In Memory of Edward Anders Sövik, FAIA



Edward Anders Sövik FAIA died on May 4, 2014 in Northfield, at age 95. Ed served on numerous AIA Minnesota boards and committees. He was a Gold Medal recipient. He was active on the national level as an NCARB director and with the NAAB. A child of missionaries to China, he entered St. Olaf College at age 17 and graduated with honors. He studied at the Art Students League in New York and at Luther Seminary in St. Paul. In 1941 he enlisted in the Marine Air Corps and flew a night fighter in the Pacific. His service was rewarded with a Purple Heart. In 1949, he finished an architectural degree at Yale and started a practice in Minnesota. Northfield Architects became Sövik Mathre Madson—then SMSQ Architects. While the firm's work included major campus buildings at St. Olaf College, Concordia College (*Moorhead*), Carleton College, and Stephens College in Missouri—Ed and the firm focused on re-thinking the design of contemporary places for worship and music. His 1973 book, *Architecture for Worship*, and dozens of articles and presentations have greatly influenced the direction of church design over the last 50 years. Edward is survived by wife Anne Running Sövik, and sons Rolf, Martin, and Peter. Memorials may be directed to St. John's Lutheran Church or St. Olaf College, both in Northfield, Luther Seminary in St. Paul, or Habitat for Humanity.
