The Minnesota Architectural Foundation Announces Winner of 2014 Ralph Rapson Traveling Study Fellowship

Minneapolis, Minnesota – The Minnesota Architectural Foundation is pleased to announce Mark Stankey, Assoc. AIA, as the winner of the 2014 Ralph Rapson Traveling Study Fellowship. The purpose of the competition is to provide young architects the opportunity to advance their education in architecture by pursuing foreign or domestic travel-study. To assist in their education, \$10,000 is awarded to the winner.

This year's program, held March 28 – April 1, 2014, was to design a 'single family' house in the manner of a case study. The jury chose five finalists from among the 36 entrants including: Thomas Clark, AIA, Michael Hara, Assoc. AIA, Mark Stankey, Assoc. AIA, Don Vu, Assoc. AIA, and Jesse Zeien, AIA. The jury members were Su Blumentals, FAIA, Eric Amel, AIA, Brian Larson, AIA, and Daniel Nepp, AIA. Each of the five finalists presented their design schemes to the jury.

A graduate of Montana State University with a Masters in Architecture in 2006, Mark has been employed with Minneapolis-based architecture firms in the past, and is currently starting a new firm. He plans to travel to Norway to further explore his fascination with how architecture interacts with the ground plane, sky and water.

All of the submissions will be displayed at the 80th Annual AIA Minnesota Convention and Products Exposition November 11-14, 2014, at the Minneapolis Convention Center.
