SAINT PAUL RIVER BALCONY COMMUNITY MEETING

Join us at a community meeting for an update on the River Balcony, a proposed 1.5-mile elevated pedestrian walkway that extends from the Science Museum of Minnesota to the Union Depot. The dramatic public promenade will link vibrant downtown places with the Mississippi River.

HIGHLIGHTS

- 1.5-mile elevated pedestrian walkway
- Designed to accommodate walking, outdoor seating, gathering, and public activities
- Seamlessly blends both urban and natural elements of the city and river
- Encourages people of all ages to interact with the Mississippi River in new ways
- Financed through public-private partnerships

A LONG-TERM VISION

The first segment of the River Balcony is likely to occur along Custom House, a 17-story luxury apartment, hotel and restaurant development on Kellogg Boulevard. The final design of Phase 1 of the River Balcony (Robert Street to Union Depot) is expected to be completed by the end of 2016.

The River Balcony Master Plan, which will guide the design of the walkway, is nearing completion. The River Balcony project will be implemented in phases over many years as public and private funding sources are realized.
