
- The PHA provides 9,436 affordable homes to over 22,000 people.

- The PHA is governed by a seven-member Board of Commissioners appointed by the Mayor and approved by the City Council.




OPTION I 3 BEDROOM, 2 BATH


Concept design


Shape, layout and design of our design is easily adapted by other existing homes.

OPTION II 4 BEDROOM, 3 BATH + 1BD optional

Concept design

The secondary unit type on this site maximizes all three levels of the home allowing for 5 spacious bedrooms (1 in the lower level of the home and 4 in the upper level). Similar to the ADA plan, there is a full bathroom on each level of the home with an additional full bath combined with laundry in the lower level. This design, utilizes a u-shaped kitchen with peninsula seating to allow for a more "open" floor plan.
